The Master of Arts in Psychology program guides students through in-depth exploration of the discipline. At the core of the program is the “generalist model,” a conceptual framework that emphasizes foundational study of theories and research methods, and factors related to human behavior including lifespan development, social and cultural diversity, assessment, personality, and psychopathology.

39 semester hrs / 13 courses

CORE COURSES (33 SEMESTER HRS / 11 COURSES)

Students must take 11 core courses. Courses include:

- » Personality and Counseling Theories

- » Tests and Measurements

MAJOR COURSE (3 SEMESTER HRS)


Students must select 1 course of the following courses:

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN PSYCHOLOGY

In AMU's psychology program, students will learn about the empirical approach used to investigate the workings of the human mind. Students may choose to focus on fields such as forensics, abnormal behavior, industry and organization, health and performance, child development, post-traumatic stress disorder, and disaster mental health.

121 semester hrs / 40 courses

GENERAL EDUCATION (37 SEMESTER HRS / 12 COURSES)

Requirements include foundations of online learning, English, history, literature and humanities, science and mathematics, political science, and social sciences.

CORE COURSES (33 SEMESTER HRS / 11 COURSES)

Students must take 11 core courses:

- » History and Systems of Psychology
- » Human Life Span Development
- » Introduction to Psychology
- » Learning and Cognition
- » Perception
- » Personality Theories
- » Professional Careers and Education in Psychology
- » Psychopathology
- » Research Methods in Psychology
- » Statistics for Social Science

MAJOR COURSES (15 SEMESTER HRS / 5 COURSES)

Students must select 5 courses from a list of 11 courses related to Social/Developmental Psychology as well as Clinical/Forensic/Applied Psychology.

Courses include:

- » Adult Development
- » Human Sexuality
- » Introduction to Child Development
- » Psychology of Terrorism
- » Sports Psychology

ELECTIVES (33 SEMESTER HRS / 11 COURSES)

Students may choose from other courses not taken to meet required, core, or major requirements.
