COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT

Students may select either a Separate Comprehensive Exam (no additional academic credit) or a Capstone Seminar in Transportation and Logistics Management (3 semester hrs).

Those who elect the Capstone option will only need 3 semester hours of elective credit.
