SAFETY CHECKLIST

- 1. Stop, look, and listen; gather information before you act.
- 2. Do not rush when the situation doesn't really require speed.
- 3. Get plenty of assistance.
- 4. Stay alert for the danger signs.
- 5. Wear your body armor.
- Maintain a reactionary gap; don't get too close too soon.
- 7. Watch your approach and positioning.
- 8. Always watch their hands.
- 9. Don't make dangerous assumptions.
- 10. Use cover properly.
- 11. Use backup wisely; follow good contact and cover tactics.
- Follow careful weapons retention practices.
- 13. Never stop looking for the next threat.
- 14. Expect the unexpected.
- 15. Make some contingency plans for surprises.
- 16. Never use "cowboy" tactics.

- 17. Never daydream on the job; stay alert.
- 18. Maintain proficiency with all your equipment through regular practice.
- 19. Realize that all equipment has limitations, and so do you.
- 20. In a crisis situation, make a decision, even if it's imperfect.
- Stay in good physical/emotional condition.
- 22. Handcuff properly.
- 23. Search correctly.
- 24. Be aware of who and what is present in your immediate environment.
- 25. Practice tactical withdrawal, as required.
- 26. Count on your good common sense.
- 27. Maintain a winning mindset.
- 28. Avoid carelessness and complacency at all costs.
- 29. Never stop learning your job.
- 30. Remember to survive mentally, too.
